- i. David (Chair)

- Labour Students

 - Did several stalls to get petitions signed for 'University Challenge'. About 400-500 signatures obtained.
- Policy debate.
 - Policy forum on House of Lords reform was interesting and successful.
- Website
 - New website on-line which is a bit improvement on what has gone before, and provides a solid basis for updates/more content &c.
- Labour party in general.
 - An important time for Labour. New leader will soon be elected, could bring a freshness to the party.
