Brief reminder of the REDUCE study work package aims:

WP1: Statistical analysis of large NHFD, hospital episodes statistics and ONS mortality dataset to identify organisational factors that explain variation in patient outcomes after hip fractures
Cost analysis to calculate the costs from hip fractures attributable to different organisational factors

WP2: Qualitative interviews at four hospitals (identified in WP1) to identify barriers and facilitators to providing consistent and high-quality fracture care

Documentary Analysis of 20 British Orthopaedic Association (BOA) reports

WP3: Implementation Toolkit development to help hospital managers, clinical leads and service organisers to commission high-quality hip fracture services, in partnership with the Royal Osteoporosis Society (ROS)

- ⇒ Obtained permission to proceed with the REDUCE research study under the umbrella Bristol Medical School Data Security and Protection application
- ⇒ Submitted both an Expression of interest (EOI) and HQIP DARF application (Data access request form) to the Falls and Fragility Fracture Audit Programme (FFFAP) for National Hip Fracture Database data. Approved 11 Dec.
- ⇒ Submitted (i) Ethics application for proportionate review for Research Ethics Committees (REC) including developing the REDUCE protocol
- ⇒ Prepared for submission (i) NHS Wales Informatics Service for Patient Episode Database for Wales (PEDW) data (ii) Data Access Request Service (DARS) application to NHS Digital for Hospital Episode Statistics (HES)
