10:15 - 11:00	<p><b>University Teachers as Mobile Learners: Will we lead by example?</b></p> <p>Invited speaker: <b>Prof. Agnes Kukulska-Hulme</b></p> <p>Abstract: In a time of change, higher education is adapting to external conditions created by increasing use of mobile and wireless technologies and mobile social media. Adaptation is necessary; consequently, we need to focus on how the academic workforce needs to adapt. Opportunities to acquire personal experience of using mobile technologies to enhance their own professional and informal learning might be the way to persuade academics that mobile technology has an important place in supporting education. In this talk I will reflect on approaches to educational professional development at The Open University and elsewhere, reflecting on what can be learnt from these cases and aiming to construct a staff development strategy for the future.</p> <p>-----</p> <p>Agnes Kukulska-Hulme is Professor of Learning Technology and Communication in the Institute of Educational Technology at The Open University, UK, and Programme Lead for the Next Generation Distance Learning research programme in the institute.
