Assumptions for Unit Directors proposing direct teaching events

- PDRA is responsible for the update and delivery of a "package" of teaching equivalent to 3 lectures or synchronous and associated asynchronous sessions
 - Assumed loading 40 to 52 hours (should be tailored to fit in this range)
 - Active contact time 3 (or 9) hours, based upon delivery equivalent to 3 x 1(3) hour existing teaching sessions/events (1hr of material) that may require updating (avoid completely new material to keep effort required manageable).
 - 7 -10 hours (1-1.5 day) per session/event for update/reconfiguration and preparation of existing material
 - Allow PDRA significant freedom on mode/method of teaching/learning
 - 2 hours per session to feed into assessment design
 - 7 hours (1 day) training

 - Unit director to provide supporting material/resources to work from
 - · Use August run of "Digital Design course" for online orientation of delivery
 - Unit director responsible to provide subject specific coaching/mentoring/feedback

Assumptions for Unit Directors proposing Project Supervision

- PDRA is responsible for the design and full supervision of up to two individual research projects (MSc major project) (and relevant roles in its assessment)
 - Assumed loading 4 hours + 24 per project per year (52 hours for two projects)
 - based upon 24 x 1 hr/wk allocation to academic staff (which includes assessment)
 - 2 hours for project design and refinement and
 - 4 hours (1/2 day) for training (including shadowing opportunities)
- Training
 - Explore local training opportunity to be delivered in winter
 - Unit director to provide some training in defining and will assume responsibility for approval of project can lead to full range of outcomes
- Requires a clear and transparent project approval process and student allocation
 - EMat have a model that is recommended
 - Need to ensure PDRA has fair access to full range of student abilities
- Either requires contract to outlast project duration or option for PDRA to act as honorary staff member
- Answerable to unit director
