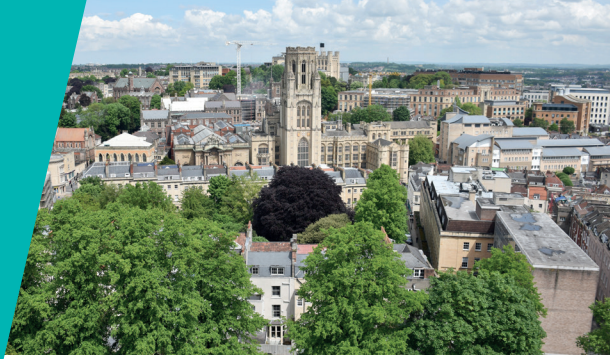

## Entry requirements

We accept a wide range of qualifications. The table below will give you an idea of the typical requirements for each study level.
