

Paying an Article Processing Charge (APC)

Some journals require an open access fee for all papers they publish. Some funders have provided the library with block grants to pay these costs. Other funders allow authors to use their grants to pay them.

You can use this route if:

- Your journal shows up in a search of the Directory of Open Access Journals: <https://doaj.org/>

And you are acknowledging funding from:

- The British Heart Foundation (BHF)
- Cancer Research UK (CRUK)
- UK Research and Innovation (UKRI)
- The Wellcome Trust (WT)

Please note: Horizon Europe (ERC), National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) and many other funders have their own methods of paying APCs and authors funded by these funders should contact them for details, or email lib-research-support@bristol.ac.uk for advice.

Checklist:

Before submitting to the Journal

- If you are funded by UKRI, Wellcome Trust, BHF or CRUK, fill out an open access claim form to log your request
- If you are funded by Horizon Europe or NIHR or another funder, check that money is available through them

When You submit to the journal

- Include the following statement in your cover letter and acknowledgements:

'For the purpose of open access, the author(s) has applied a Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY) licence to any Author Accepted Manuscript version arising from this submission.'

When your article is accepted

- Arrange payment for any open access fees, following the instructions the library or your funder have given you
- If the publisher asks what licence you want, select CC-BY
- Add a record to Pure (<https://research-information.bris.ac.uk/pure>). You do not need to upload a file

Upon Publication

- Update the record on Pure with the DOI number.
