## MB21 The new undergraduate medical curriculum at Bristol

A new undergraduate medical curriculum is currently being developed. One of the aims is better integration of science and clinical learning in all years. Case based learning will be one of the main teaching strategies to facilitate this. The new curriculum will start in 2017-18 with Year 1. Other years will be phased in one by one so that from the academic year 2022-23 the entire new curriculum will be in force. There will be some changes to other years before 2022. From 2017-18 onwards it is planned that Year 5 students will have 4 weeks in Primary Care instead of the current 2 weeks. We will keep you informed via this newsletter and roadshows planned for later this year.
