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### How to add a supervisor to consultations in EMIS web

With students running their own surgeries it is important to have accurate records including who was supervising them. When creating a new consultation it is easy to add this within Emis web by following 4 steps:

Consultation Properties

#### Step 1

When you create a new consultation set your student as the consulter, then click on extended properties.

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#### Step 2

Click the search button next to the Accompanying HCP (health care professional)

#### Step 3

Search for yourself and double click to select, then clic ok

#### Step 4

Your final dialogue box should show your student as consulter and yourself as accompanying HCP. This will be logged in the consultation history and can be audited with population manager.

This is also useful for recording chaperones during consultations or having other colleagues such as registrars during joint surgeries.
