

Happy New Year to all our GP Teachers

Where do GPs come from?

That is a searchable question and you can find plenty of evidence in the education literature. The simple answer is that **students are more likely to consider GP as a career if they have more time learning in General Practice.** A paper by Alberti et al published in the BJGP in 2017 demonstrated a statistically significant relationship between the quantity of authentic GP teaching sessions per medical school and the percentage of their F2 graduates who selected GP training programmes.

In MB21 Year 4 we have more than doubled GP sessions, from 30 in MB16 to **72 in MB21** and improved the balance of teaching and payment.
