Student Choice placements (replacing SSCs) for Summer 2020 in MB21 Year 3

Why supervise a student choice placement?

Useful to your practice, e.g. undertaking quality improvement, developing patient materials or helping to evaluate your service.

Students are enthusiastic, having chosen a project they want to do Engage with, inspire and be inspired by the next generation of clinicians

What is involved?

Placements will run in a 6-week block at the end of the academic year.

Placements should help students to explore 'evidence-based' medicine in the broadest sense'. Students will choose an area of study, collect data, analyse it and reflect on its use in clinical settings. Students will be expected to work largely independently with some support.

Being an OSCE examination observer by Dr Cara Harris, Salaried GP at Tyntesfield Medical Group

I was starting my new role as a honorary GP teaching fellow and, while at one of the Year 2 & 3 workshops, I recalled being asked by my previous students what would be expected of them at their MDEMO exams; I was honest with them that I wasn't entirely sure. I discussed with the Rheumatology consultant at the Year 2 & 3 workshop about coming to observe the MDEMO exams. It was easy to arrange via their team for the next MDEMO exams one month later.

I spent 2 hours at the MDEMO exam and focused on the different musculoskeletal stations of history taking, examinations and clinical reasoning. It was great to talk to the examiners and patients, hear the types of questions asked for the clinical reasoning station and see the details of the mark sheet for the joint examination stations.

It was odd to hear the station start and finish bells going but being on the other side for a change!

It has really helped me set my expectations of what is required of myself and my Year 3 students during their sessions in Primary Care. I understand the MDEMO exam itself has been amalgamated into the end of year OSCEs but would highly recommend popping along to observe their exams if you get a chance!
