Indemnity for medical students

Following the Secretary of State for Health's decision to introduce a state-backed indemnity scheme for GPs from early 2019, the landscape regarding this topic is uncertain. As this becomes more certain we will update our advice. For the time being we advise that medical students should be supervised by a GP throughout their time in your surgery and that your medical defence organisation is made aware that you engage in the education of medical undergraduates. Should you delegate responsibility for teaching to another member of the practice team you should retain overall supervisory responsibility to ensure that the student will be protected vicariously through your own/the practice's indemnity scheme.
