### Top Teaching Tips from the Year 5 workshop

- 1. Teach students to be holistic and build rapport
- Consider what it would be like to be that patient and include this in your presentation
- Find out one interesting non-medical thing about the person
- 2. Beware hearing problems when assessing cognition!
- 3. Presenting patients succinctly—**SBAR** (Situation Background Assessment Response)
- 4. Chest pain triage
- Ask the student to make the 999 call
- Teach: Don't ask patient to dial 999, do it yourself, patients may collapse before they do
